CALL TO ORDER - 7:30 P.M.

PRESENTATION BY MAGGIE METZLER FOR YUMA COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Ms. Maggie Metzler provided Council with information for funding requests for Yuma County Economic Development and gave an update on Yuma County Economic Development.

PRESENTATION BY KIMBERLY MIHELICH WITH COLORADO RURAL WATER ASSOCIATION

Ms. Kimberly Mihelich, with Colorado Rural Water Association, updated Council on Source Water Protection Plans. This is a voluntary program for municipalities. The City was awarded a \$5,000 grant to help with this process. It is a matching funds grant, but the matching funds can be in-kind. The first meeting for the Protection Plan will be held on October 4 and the process is planned to be completed by March, 2019. Discussion was held.

- C. FIRST READING ORDINANCE #23, SERIES OF 2018 (AMENDING THE CITY OF YUMA ZONING MAP AND REZONING THE PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS LOTS 4, 5, 6, AND 7 AND THE EAST ½ OF LOTS 8 & 9, ALL OF BLOCK 4, OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN PLAT OF YUMA FROM RESIDENTIAL TO HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL – 2 (C-2)) – SCOTT MOORE. Manager Moore explained Council Member Baucke will be leaving the room for this item. This is for the re-zoning of the mortuary property and a piece of property adjoining the mortuary where the house was torn down. The property

is zoned R-1 and it is being proposed to re-zone the property to C-2. Swehla moved to approve on first reading Ordinance #23, Series of 2018. Second by Hoch. Question. 6 ayes. 1 abstain (Baucke). Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING ON SECOND READING ORDINANCE #18, SERIES OF 2018 (AMENDING SECTION 9.28.040, 9.40.101, AND 17.06.615 OF THE YUMA MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ALCOHOL AND MEDICAL MARIJUANA TO BRING THE CODE UP TO DATE WITH CHANGES IN STATE LAW) – KARMA WELLS. Clerk/Treasurer Wells introduced the ordinance. Public hearing was opened. No comments were made. Public hearing was closed. Swehla moved to approve on second reading Ordinance #18, Series of 2018. Second by Baucke. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- E. PUBLIC HEARING ON SECOND READING ORDINANCE #19, SERIES OF 2018 (REPEALING CHAPTER 17.13 OF THE YUMA MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING HISTORIC PRESERVATION) – KARMA WELLS. Clerk/Treasurer Wells introduced the ordinance. Public hearing was opened. No comments were made. Public hearing was closed. Baucke moved to approve on second reading Ordinance #19, Series of 2018. Second by Goeglein. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- F. PUBLIC HEARING ON SECOND READING ORDINANCE #20, SERIES OF 2018 (AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE YUMA MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING FEES AND OTHER ASSOCIATED REVISIONS, INCLUDING REMOVAL OF REFERENCES TO THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR IN TITLE 17) – KARMA WELLS. Clerk/Treasurer Wells introduced the ordinance. Public hearing was opened. No comments were made. Public hearing was closed. Swehla moved to approve on second reading Ordinance #20, Series of 2018. Second by Baucke. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- G. PUBLIC HEARING ON SECOND READING ORDINANCE #21, SERIES OF 2018 (RESCINDING ORDINANCE #12, SERIES OF 2016, WHICH RENEWED A FRANCHISE WITH BCI JAMES CABLE, LLC) SCOTT MOORE. Manager Moore introduced the ordinance. Public hearing was opened. No comments were made. Public hearing was closed. Baucke moved to approve on second reading Ordinance #21, Series of 2018. Second by Hoch. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- FIRST READING ORDINANCE #22, SERIES OF 2018 (REPEALING SECTIONS 9.16.010 AND 9.16.050 OF THE YUMA MUNICIPAL CODE) – SCOTT MOORE. Manager Moore stated this ordinance will repeal portions of the code that are no longer needed. Baucke moved to approve on first reading Ordinance #22, Series of 2018. Second by Goeglein. CITY MANAGER, SCOTT MOORE

In the next couple of months the Police Department will be out of the fingerprint business, due to CBI going digital. It would cost approximately \$25,000 to buy the equipment to do digital fingerprints.
