REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2019

CALL TO ORDER - 7:30 P.M.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY MAYOR SWEHLA AND THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE WAS RECITED.

CORRECTIONS OR ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

Clerk/Treasurer Wells stated there were no corrections or additions to the Agenda, but the agenda is different than what was mailed in the packets, but it has been posted for 24 hours.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Goeglein moved to approve the October 15, 2019, Agenda as presented. Second by Chrismer. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.

PRESENTATION OF THE PRELIMINARY 2020 BUDGET

Manager Moore presented Council with the Preliminary 2020 Budget. Council set up a budget workshop for November 5 at 5:00 P.M.

ACTION ITEMS

- A. RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT WITH CITY MANAGER SCOTT MOORE KARMA WELLS. Clerk/Treasurer Wells stated the temporary employment agreement with City Manager Scott Moore will need to be renewed. There are 3 weeks between meetings, so the agreement should be approved for four weeks this time. Hoch moved to approve the temporary employment agreement with City Manager Scott Moore. Second by Saffer. Question. 6 ayes. 1 nay (Baucke). Motion carried.
- B. RENEWAL OF EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE SCOTT MOORE. Manager Moore stated we have two proposals. One from HealthEZ, a subsidiary of PFS and one from CEBT, our current carrier for health insurance coverage. Our current insurance coverage will increase approximately \$27,000 per year with CEBT. The quote from HealthEZ is not the same plan the City currently has. Mayor Pro Tem Goeglein stated the plans from the two companies are not apples to apples. Discussion was held. Chrismer moved to renew the City's health insurance with CEBT. Second by Baucke. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- **C. APPROVAL OF BILLS KARMA WELLS.** Clerk/Treasurer Wells provided Council with an additional list of bills. Goeglein moved to approve the bills. Second by Chrismer. Question. 7 ayes. Motion carried.
- D. PURCHASES IN EXCESS OF \$5,000 SCOTT MOORE. There were no purchases in excess of \$5,000.

ADDITIONAL BUSINESS None. **REPORTS CITY MANAGER, SCOTT MOORE** Manager Moore asked if Council was in favor of the Mason's moving forward with the cornerstone dedication in April 2020. Council's consensus was to go ahead with the cornerstone. CITY CLERK/TREASURER, KARMA WELLS None. CITY COUNCIL REPORTS Baucke Council Member Baucke stated he would like to see a letter sent to people on Main Street to have flower pots, picnic tables, etc. removed from the sidewalks for snow removal. Goeglein Mayor Pro Tem Goeglein asked if there are enough leaf containers to be sat around. Manager Moore said we purchased more containers this year and they are all currently out. Discussion was held.
